

Student barred for smoking hookah gets partial relief

New Delhi: Delhi high court on Monday stepped in to ensure a Class IX student resumes his studies in a private school from which he had been suspended. Justice Rajiv Shukla issued notice to the school authorities and directed it to permit the student to attend classes as an interim measure.

The minor was suspended after allegedly being caught on video smoking hookah at a party.

The student's parents had said that the action of the school — not allowing their child to attend classes on the ground of smoking hookah — was "unjust, illegal, arbitrary, anti-child and violated the Right to Education as guaranteed by the Constitution."

The school authorities have been directed to permit the student to attend classes

As per the terms of provisions of Rules 11 (3) of Delhi Right of Children to Free and Compulsory Education Act, 2011, the respondent school is under obligation to provide free education up to Class XII to EWS category students.

The teenager, who belongs to EWS category, was allegedly caught in a video smoking hookah with his friends at a restaurant. After the video was posted on social media, the school administration suspended him on October 9 and stopped him from writing the examination held between October 11 and October 17.

The petitioner's counsel informed the court that the video was from August 2019, when the student, along with a few of his friends, had gone to a pub at Kalkaji to celebrate his friend's birthday party. The counsel said that neither he nor his friends were in school uniform. One of his friends uploaded the alleged video on social media and it was to the notice of the school principal.

Despite apology by the petitioner and his parents and an assurance that he would not indulge in such activity in future, the school did not allow the student to attend classes from October 9, the court was informed.

It also asked the court-appointed receiver and senior advocate R Venkataramani to hold talks with private real estate companies whether they would be willing to take over some of the projects and invest money.

Venkataramani told the bench that some banks are ready to plunge in and provide funds by taking the unsold flats of Amrapali as security and assured the court that he would finalise the modalities by holding consultations with them. The court directed banks and financial institutions to release funds to home-buyers who have taken loans but payments were stopped due to delay in construction.


As per the forensic auditors' report, there are around 5,229 unsold flats in different Amrapali projects and at least Rs 1,958 crore could be raised by selling them. They said the Group sold 5,856 flats at low prices and Rs 321.31 crore can be recovered from these flat-buyers. It also said promoters and directors used funds for personal use and around Rs 455 crore can be recovered.
